WHEREAS, across New Jersey, the conditions in which we live, work and age in combination with wellness, particularly rising obesity rates and decreasing physical activity, impacts our overall health; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and the United States Environmental Protection Agency are collaborating during the month of January to promote the need for radon testing in an effort to protect the lives of our State's residents.

F. <u>RESOLUTION #24-1-59</u> – <u>Authorizing Lease of Public Property by Submission of Sealed Bids</u> for Wireless Telecommunications Facility

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of the Local Lands and Buildings Law (N.J.S.A. 40A:12-14) ("LLBL") a municipal corporation may lease to any private person real property owned by said municipal corporation which is not needed for a public use; and

WHEREAS, the LLBL requires that a lease by a municipal corporation to a private person, except for a lease to a private person for a public purpose, be made to the highest bidder by open public bidding at auction or by submission of sealed bids; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Montgomery ("Township") currently leases a 45-acre parcel of property identified on the Township Tax Map as Block 20001, Lot 10.05 (the "Property") pursuant to a Lease Purchase Agreement with the Somerset County Improvement Authority; and

WHEREAS, the Lease Purchase Agreement allows the Township to rent or lease the Property; and

WHEREAS, there are substantial gaps in wireless communications service and emergency services communications coverage in Skillman; and

WHEREAS, there is a need to provide for wireless communications service and emergency services communications coverage in Skillman; and

WHEREAS, the Township has determined to lease an approximately 3,000 square foot area of Block 20001, Lot 10.05, north of Orchard Road and west of Community Drive (the "Premises"), which Premises is not needed for public use and which is suitable for the construction of a wireless communications tower which will address the need for wireless communications service and emergency services communications coverage in Skillman.

WHEREAS, the improvements and the related support facilities shall be constructed at the sole cost and expense of the successful bidder and the Township shall have the right to locate its antennas to said tower once constructed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Montgomery, County of Somerset, State of New Jersey as follows:

- 1. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12-14, the Township, through its Administrator or designee, is hereby authorized and directed to solicit sealed bids for the lease of the approximately 3,000 square foot area of Block 20001, Lot 10.05, north of Orchard Road and west of Community Drive (the "Premises") for purposes of designing, constructing and operating a wireless communications tower and ancillary support equipment, structures and foundations on the Premises; at such time and place as deemed appropriate and necessary to effectuate the terms hereof.
- 2. The Administrator and Qualified Purchasing Agent shall cause said bidding to be advertised in accordance with the requirements of N.J.S.A. 40A:12-14(a) by causing the advertisement to be published in a newspaper circulating in the Township by two insertions at least once a week during two consecutive weeks, the last publication to be not earlier than seven (7) days prior to the date of the bid opening. Said advertisement shall specify that the minimum rental bid shall be \$40,000 and that the Township reserves the right to reject all bids where the highest bid is not accepted.

G. <u>RESOLUTION #24-1-60</u> – <u>Supporting the Designation of the Sourland Mountain Region as a</u> Special Resource Area

WHEREAS, the Township of Montgomery previously supported the designation of the Sourland Mountain Region ("Region") as a Special Resource Area ("SRA") in the State Development and Redevelopment Plan by Resolution #04-8-286, adopted August 19, 2004 which recognized that the Sourland Mountain Region comprises the headwaters of many streams in the Region and surrounding towns; that its forested areas maintain the stream water and groundwater quality, including drinking water; that it provides habitat for many threatened and endangered species as well as offers many unique scenic, historic, agricultural and recreational resources for residents and visitors; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Montgomery remains desirous in supporting the designation of the Sourland Mountain Region as a Special Resource Areas; and

WHEREAS, the Sourland Mountain Region, defined by its unique geology, encompasses 90 square miles, including parts of eight municipalities in Mercer, Somerset and Hunterdon Counties; and

WHEREAS, the Sourlands, home of the largest contiguous forest in Central New Jersey, are an island of biodiversity in a sea of encroaching sprawl; and

WHEREAS, the Sourlands are home to dozens of rare and endangered species of plants and animals, and an irreplaceable stopover for migrating birds; and

WHEREAS, the Sourland forest is the most intensive carbon sink anywhere in New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, more than 90 miles of streams in the region are "first order" streams, the critical headwaters to the Raritan and Millstone Rivers, an important source of drinking water for New Jersey residents; and

WHEREAS, the Sourlands are enjoyed and relied on by countless urban and suburban New Jerseyans as a recreational resource; and

WHEREAS the Sourland forest is losing more than a million trees (about a quarter of the forest) to the Emerald Ash Borer, and more to emerging threats; and

WHEREAS, natural forest regeneration is impossible in the Sourlands because of the vast overpopulation of white-tailed deer; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey is currently updating the State Plan; and
