Block 28009, Lots 1, 2 & 3 Amended Preliminary and Final Major Site Plan with Bulk Variances

As requested, this office has reviewed the landscaping for the two modified stacked multifamily buildings for the above referenced application prepared by Dynamic Engineering, dated 5/17/2023, revised 8/08/2023. The following comments are offered for you consideration and require attention.

- 1. The American Hornbeam (Carpinus caroliniana) is typically used as an understory tree, commonly grown as a low-branching specimen. Notes shall be included in the landscape schedule that specify the trees to have been trained for street tree purposes with a single stem with a minimum branching height of 7' above the surrounding grade.
- 2. It is recommended that the specified Hackberry (Celtis x occidentalis) tree be specified as the 'Prairie Pride' Hackberry (Celtis x occidentalis 'Prairie Pride') variety. This improved variety has be developed with more insect resistance and is less prone to withes broom, a very common disfigurement of the branches of this species.
- 3. The 'Redmond' (Tilia americana 'Redmond') is a more appropriate variety and is preferred over the specified straight species of Basswood (Tilia americana). The Redmond cultivar has a more upright habit with branches that will not droop as much as the straight species.
- 4. White Pine (Pinus strobus) evergreen trees tends to become a less effective evergreen buffer with time. Multiple alternate evergreen species should be specified in it place.
- 5. The specified Japanese Holly shrubs (Ilex crenata 'Steeds' and Ilex crenata 'Sky Pencil') are invasive plant species and should not be used in Montgomery. Alternate evergreen shrubs shall be specified in their place.
