
Household Hazardous Waste Day - June 17

The Somerset County Hazardous Waste Collection Program gives residents and farmers a legal and cost-free way to dispose of unwanted household items that cannot be disposed of in the regular trash. This dropoff opportunity is for residents only.





Occupants should remain in their vehicles until otherwise instructed and store hazardous materials in trunks, cargo areas or truck beds.

Five events are held annually at various locations around the county from **9 a.m. to 2 p.m.** to enable residents to take advantage of the program. **Following is the 2023 schedule:**

Hazardous Waste Accepted

- · ammonia-based cleaners
- antifreeze
- banned or outdated pesticides
- batteries (rechargeable and button-cell)
- brake fluids
- fire extinguishers
- fluorescent tubes and compact fluorescent lights
- gasoline
- kerosene
- mercury & mercury switches
- motor oil (2-gallon maximum) & filters
- paints (latex & oil-based)
- pool chemicals
- propane tanks (barbecue style)
- transmission fluid
- wet-cell car batteries
- used cooking oil
- used oil filters

RxMission Drive-In/Drop-Off medicine-collection program is held in conjunction with scheduled Hazardous Waste drop-off events, rain or shine. Residents can safely dispose of unwanted or outdated prescription drugs and over-the-counter medications from their homes. Sheriff's officers are on hand to accept the medications. Items Not Accepted

- 55 gallon drums
- air conditioners, dehumidifiers or any items containing a refrigerant
- carbon monoxide detectors
- dioxins
- electronic waste (computers and televisions)
- explosives
- infectious waste
- gas cylinders
- PCBs
- Pentachlorophenol and 2, 4, 5-TP (Silvex)
- smoke alarms

- tires
- unknown or unidentified material
