

MINUTES FOR
MONTGOMERY TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE MEETING
July 7, 2016

1. Montgomery Township Committee met at the Municipal Building, 2261 Van Horne Road, Belle Mead, NJ at 7:00 p.m. on the above date. Those present were:

2. Mayor Graham stated the following: "Under the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act, notice of the time and place of this meeting has been posted and sent to the officially designated newspapers."

3. Mayor Graham led the Salute to the Flag.

4. **TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE APPOINTMENT - Chief Financial Officer**

BE IT RESOLVED That Michael W. Pitts, Jr. is hereby appointed Chief Financial Officer, 4 year term expiring December 31, 2020.

5. **EAGLE SCOUT PROCLAMATION - Matthew Heebner, Harrison Max and Alex Fernandez**

WHEREAS, The prestigious rank of Eagle Scout with the Boy Scouts of America has been earned by Matthew Heebner, Harrison Max and Alex Fernandez; and

WHEREAS, The standards established for this honor are high and very difficult to achieve; and

WHEREAS, Those who have worked diligently to achieve this rank have exhibited excellence in leadership and a deep commitment to their community.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED That, with great pride, the Montgomery Township Committee congratulates Matthew Heebner, Harrison Max and Alex Fernandez on this remarkable achievement and extends its sincere wishes for continued success.

- 5-1. Committeeman Conforti moved the adoption of the foregoing resolution. The motion was seconded by Committeeman Smith and carried unanimously.

- 5-2. Matthew Heebner stated that his Eagle Scout project involved an outdoor classroom at the Montgomery Upper Middle School. The classroom is located by the Library and the tennis courts. He worked with a teacher at the school and with the Board of Education on this project.

- 5-3. Alex Fernandez stated that his Eagle Scout project involved constructing and installing three (3) 2 foot by 1 foot owl houses 15 feet high in trees at Farmview Fields, Woodfield Preservation and Witherspoon Woods. Owls left the area due to the Transco pipeline installation. He was hoping the owls would return to the area if he built the owl houses. A few months after the installation, he checked and found signs that the owls were using the houses.

6. **PUBLIC COMMENT**

- 6-1. Anthony Romagnole, Van Zandt Road, congratulated the Eagle Scouts on their achievement. He stated that putting Eagle Scout of a job application or in a resume is a benefit as it shows goal orientation and a great work ethic.

7. QUIET ZONE PRESENTATION - Gail Smith and Joseph Fishinger

7-1. Gail Smith, Township Engineer, stated that there was a Professional Services resolution on the agenda to approve the services of an engineer for the investigation and design of a quiet zone in the Township. She explained what a quiet zone was. The Federal Railroad Administration ("FRA") requires the sounding of a horn at all at-grade railroad crossings. Approximately 10 or 12 years ago, the FRA adopted a rule that allows for the establishment of quiet zones. What that means is that the train engineer cannot sound the horn at a quiet zone. If the train engineer sees something that might pose a danger, he can sound the horn. The requirement to create a quiet zone is that the crossing has to be above the average National Risk Threshold without the horn sounding. Montgomery has four (4) at-grade crossings. The Route 601 crossing already has a quiet zone run by Somerset County. The other crossings are Hollow Road, Springhill Road and Provinceline Road. She explained that the Provinceline Road crossing is on the Montgomery/Hopewell Municipal boundary. The steps the Township would need to take in order to establish a quiet zone are:

- Collect current traffic and crossing information;
- Put that information into quiet zone calculator on the FRA website;
- Look at different options for improvements to the crossing that will get the Township above the threshold so a quiet zone can be established;
- Once there is an option the Township feels is feasible, schedule a diagnostic team meeting with New Jersey Department of Transportation.

She explained that the NJDOT has jurisdiction over the crossings and they might want additional improvements from what the Township thought would be appropriate. There would also be a meeting with Somerset County because any new Quiet Zone would be an extension of the existing Route 601 Quiet Zone. There would also need to be a meeting with Hopewell Township because the Provinceline Road crossing is on the border of both municipalities. Once these meetings occur, the Township will develop the conceptual design and preliminary cost estimates and present that to the Governing Body to determine what direction would be appropriate. Once that decision is made, then the Township can proceed with final design and contract documents suitable for bidding. She stated that there was a proposal from RBA Group to do the work.

7-2. Joseph Fishinger, RBA Group and former Somerset County Traffic Engineer, gave a brief history of his career. The Quiet Zone process is basically evaluating each of the crossings and seeing where each is at this point. Based on his preliminary research none of the three crossings, as they are right now, would qualify for a Quiet Zone. Right now, with the horn, they are below the risk threshold and the important thing is it has to be below that threshold in order to make it a Quiet Zone, but once you turn the horns off they jump over the threshold. He explained that it doesn't necessarily mean that something has to be done at every single crossing. He stated that the law allows the Township to look at a Quiet Zone as multiple crossings in one zone. This allows you to average the scores. All of the information that the Township has is incorrect and needs to be updated. He explained that the Township might want to meet with Somerset County as the County has done this kind of thing, and can explain each step and what could be done to possibly make this a joint Quiet Zone with Somerset County for all four (4) crossings. Once this is completed, then final design can be done. This would be the final drawings to put whatever the improvements are down on paper. It then goes to the Township Engineer to go out to bid for construction. He explained what the basic options would be for the crossings. He stated that if the Professional Services Resolution was passed tonight, he will begin work. He will present his report to the Governing Body in approximately two (2) months. He stated that he would also have to look at the impact any of these improvements would have on the driveways in that area.

7-3. Committeewoman Madrid brought up the liability issue. Mr. Fishinger explained that once an improvement is done the liability changes. He stated that the Federal Railroad Administration is liable for all unimproved railroad crossing, so that if there is an accident and the person(s) file suit against the Township, the Township can file a dismissal because they have not changed the crossing.

7-4. Greg Renga, Van Pelt Court, stated that he didn't feel there was any better level of safety than the barriers. He explained that if they weren't up to standards, there would not be over 500 crossings using the system.

He asked if the Township could do the study in phases. Perhaps there wouldn't have to be so much paid up front unless it gets to a certain phase in the project to warrant the rest of the funds to execute the back half of the project.

7-5. Anthony Romagnole, Van Zandt Road, stated that the residents in the area of the railroad crossing would very much like to have a Quiet Zone and they would like to have safer crossings. The chance of the Township being sued is higher now than it would be with the barriers. He suggested using the Quick Curb system or similar.

Deputy Mayor Trzaska stated that the Governing Body needed to do this study to see which direction they should take. They have to check out all options.

16. **RESOLUTION #16-7-180 - TO AFFIRM THE TOWNSHIP OF MONTGOMERY'S CIVIL RIGHTS POLICY WITH RESPECT TO ALL OFFICIALS, APPOINTEES, EMPLOYEES, PROSPECTIVE EMPLOYEES, VOLUNTEERS, INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS, AND MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC THAT COME INTO CONTACT WITH MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES, OFFICIALS AND VOLUNTEERS**

WHEREAS, It is the policy of the Township of Montgomery to treat the public, employees, prospective employees, appointees, volunteers and contractors in a manner consistent with all applicable civil rights laws and regulations, including but not limited to, the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1964 as subsequently amended, the New Jersey Law against Discrimination, the Americans with Disabilities Act and the Conscientious Employee Protection Act, as all may be amended from time to time; and

WHEREAS, The Township Committee of the Township of Montgomery has determined that certain procedures need to be established to accomplish this policy.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED By the Township Committee of the Township of Montgomery, County of Somerset, New Jersey, as follows:

1. No official, employee, appointee or volunteer of the Township of Montgomery by whatever title known, or any entity that is in any way a part of the Township, shall engage, either directly or indirectly in any act (including the failure to act) that constitutes discrimination, harassment or a violation of any person's constitutional rights while such official, employee, appointee, volunteer or entity is engaged in Township business, acting on behalf of the Township or using the Township's facilities or property.
2. The prohibitions and requirements of this resolution shall extend to any person or entity, including but not limited to, any volunteer organization or inter-local organization, whether structured as a governmental entity or a private entity that receives authorization or support in any way from the Township to provide services that otherwise could be performed by the Township.
3. Discrimination, harassment and civil rights shall be defined for purposes of this resolution using the latest definitions contained in the applicable Federal and State laws concerning discrimination, harassment and civil rights.
4. The Township Committee shall establish written procedures for any person to report alleged discrimination, harassment and violations of civil rights prohibited by this resolution. Such procedures shall include alternate ways to report a complaint so that the person making the complaint need not communicate with the alleged violator in the event the alleged violator would be the normal contact for such complaints.
5. No person shall retaliate against any person who reports any alleged discrimination, harassment or violation of civil rights, provided however, that any person who reports alleged violations in bad faith shall be subject to appropriate discipline.
6. The Township Committee shall establish written procedures that require all officials, employees, appointees and volunteers of the Township, as well as all other entities subject to this resolution, to periodically complete training concerning their duties, responsibilities and rights pursuant to this resolution.
7. The Township Administrator, or his/her designee, shall establish a system to monitor compliance and shall report at least annually to the Township Committee the results of the monitoring.
8. At least annually, the Township Administrator, or his/her designee, shall cause a summary of this resolution and the procedures established pursuant to this resolution to be communicated within the Township. This communication shall include a statement from the Township Committee expressing its unequivocal commitment to enforce this resolution. This summary shall also be posted on the Township's web site.
9. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
10. A copy of this resolution shall be published in the official newspaper of the Township in order for the public to be made aware of this policy and the Township's commitment to the implementation and enforcement of this policy.

24. **TRANSCO**

Administrator Nieman reported that a Transco public hearing on the pipeline is scheduled for August 9, 2016 at 7:00 p.m. at the Montgomery Upper Middle School.

25. **ROUTE 518 BRIDGE IN ROCKY HILL**

Administrator Nieman stated that the bridge on Route 518 in Rocky Hill has been closed. The Police Department has been focusing on the Griggstown Causeway because the bridge traffic is going that way, and the one lane bridge is creating a traffic problem.
