

MINUTES FOR
MONTGOMERY TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE MEETING
June 18, 2020

1. Montgomery Township Committee met at the Municipal Building, 2261 Van Horne Road, Belle Mead, NJ at 7:00 p.m. on the above date. Those present were:

2. Mayor Jaffer stated the following: "Although this meeting is the regularly scheduled meeting of the Montgomery Township Committee, due to the State of Emergency that exists as a result of the COVID-19 Coronavirus crisis, and in accordance with Executive Order No. 104 issued by Governor Murphy on Monday, March 16 limiting public gatherings, this meeting is being held virtually by webcast, simulcast on Comcast Cable Channel 29. Instructions for participating in this meeting are provided on the Township's website at www.twp.montgomery.nj.us."

3. Mayor Jaffer led the Salute to the Flag.

4. **PRINCETON COUNCIL CIVIL RIGHTS COMMISSION PRESENTATION**

Mayor Jaffer introduced Leticia Fraga, Princeton Council Liaison to Princeton Civil Rights Committee; and Thomas A. Parker, Princeton Civil Rights Commission Chair.

Ms. Fraga and Mr. Parker gave a brief background and presentation about the Princeton Civil Rights Commission. It was originally established in 1964 after the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and reaffirmed after events like the Rodney King beating. The current Civil Rights Commission wasn't re-established until 2019. This Commission does not have enforcement power because it is a volunteer committee. The main purpose is educational outreach, but it does offer conflict resolution. They stated that they would provide the Township with all information and a sample ordinance for this Commission and would be glad to come back and talk more about this topic.

Mayor Jaffer asked if they had anything to do with students and the schools. Ms. Fraga replied that they most definitely work with the students and schools. She stated that she is also the liaison to the Youth Advisory Committee who has formed a civil rights subcommittee to work with the Princeton Civil Rights Commission.

Deputy Mayor Schuldiner stated that he was happy to see a conflict resolution process in a governmental setting, even if it has been only for approximately one year.

Committeewoman Gural inquired if there was any "close the loop" tracking done regarding complaints where there is a hand off to another entity. Ms. Fraga stated that she has been advocating for that. Mr. Parker reviewed their complaint process for the Governing Body.

Mayor Jaffer thanked Ms. Fraga and Mr. Parker for their attendance and presentation at this meeting.

5. **COVID-19 VIRUS UPDATE**

Health Officer Stephanie Carey stated that New Jersey has entered Phase 2 of the reopening process. She reminded all that it is important to remain vigilant in wearing of masks, social distancing and staying home when sick. She updated the amount of COVID-19 cases in the area. She explained that the Health Department is working with restaurants, pool companies, and summer camps on their reopening. She spoke about the contact tracing program. She stated that they are working on setting up a listening session for the residents and business owners in town.

Committeewoman Keenan asked what is being done in terms of monitoring. Ms. Carey explained that the "Surge Team or Contact Tracing Team" is working on some spot checks and pre-education. Committeewoman Keenan inquired if there is a process in place for people who notice discrepancies in the procedures. Ms. Carey stated that there is a complaint process.

Mayor Jaffer stated that the municipality has been helping businesses adjust to the new realities and to make sure that they are as safe as possible.

6. **RESOLUTION - JUNETEENTH FREEDOM DAY - June 19, 2020**

WHEREAS, Our Country is made up of people from every nation on earth, who are declared equal not only in freedom but also in justice, both of which are essential for a healthy human civilization; and

WHEREAS, Our nation was conceived on July 4th, 1776 with the Declaration of Independence, the classic statement being: "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness"; and

WHEREAS, At 2:00 p.m. on New Year's Day, January 1, 1863, using his war powers as President, Abraham Lincoln signed the Emancipation Proclamation, providing that all persons held as slaves within any State or designated part of a State "shall be then, thenceforward, and forever free;" and

WHEREAS, The Emancipation Proclamation made the permanent abolition of slavery a Union war aim and provided the legal framework for the emancipation of nearly all four million slaves as the Union armies advanced; and

WHEREAS, Hearing of the Proclamation, many slaves escaped to Union lines as the army units moved south; and

WHEREAS, When Union Army General Gordon Granger landed at the Texas port city of Galveston in 1865 as the Civil War drew to a close, one of his first actions was to read General Order #3, which stated that all slaves are free and that former masters and slaves have absolute equality of personal and property rights; and

WHEREAS, Following his statement, June 19 (Juneteenth) became the emancipation date of those long suffering for freedom; and

WHEREAS, Since then, as the oldest known celebration commemorating the end of slavery in America, the tradition of celebrating Juneteenth has remained strong well into the 21st century to recognize the triumph of the human spirit over the cruelty of slavery and to honor the strength, endurance, and faith of African American ancestors.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED That the Montgomery Township Committee hereby proclaims June 19, 2020 Juneteenth Freedom Day in Montgomery Township and encourages residents, schools, businesses and community groups to celebrate Juneteenth as a day of remembrance and celebration.

- 6-1. Deputy Mayor Schuldiner moved the adoption of the foregoing resolution. The motion was seconded by Committeewoman Keenan and carried unanimously.

7. **RESOLUTION HONORING EMS CADETS**

WHEREAS, A community possesses no greater treasure than the dedicated service of its volunteers; and

WHEREAS, When Montgomery EMS was officially formed on June 1, 1972, it consisted of approximately 50 volunteer members who provided emergency medical services 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year; and

WHEREAS, The following Montgomery EMS Cadets have graduated to full members and are to be recognized for their contributions while cadets to this great organization:

WHEREAS, These Cadets joined the Montgomery EMS as early as age 16; have completed the full, rigorous 210 hour EMT certification class and passed the National Registry EMT exam; volunteered with Montgomery EMS at least 20 hours a month; have assisted in squad fundraising activities and stood by to provide medical support for a multitude of community events; and have served the health and safety of residents through thousands of volunteer hours on 9-1-1 duty shifts.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Montgomery Township Committee congratulates the 2020 Montgomery EMS Cadet Program graduates on all their past accomplishments and expresses deep gratitude for their continued commitment to the citizens of Montgomery Township on this 18th day of June, 2020.

- 7-1. Deputy Mayor Schuldiner moved the adoption of the foregoing resolution. The motion was seconded by Committeeman Huang and carried unanimously.

8. **EAGLE SCOUT PRESENTATION** - Matt Sipos

Township Clerk Donna Kula updated the Committee on Matt Sipos' Eagle Scout project design. He would like to build a Kiosk at the Montgomery Arboretum on the south side of the parking lot, 1 foot away from the rail. He worked with Mr. Koplik and the Shade Tree Committee regarding features that would help make the kiosk a better fit for the Arboretum. This will be a one-sided kiosk made out of pressure-treated lumber with the side showing a map of the park and a tree cross-section. The items in the kiosk will be in a plexiglass case that can easily be open so the map can be replaced if needed. The side will display a 29-inch cross-section of a tree from a local area, with facts and history about the type of tree and the rings. The tree will be on the right side of the display with a polyurethane finish. The cross-section will be supplied by a tree service in Somerville. The goal of the project is to display the map of the park and show the history of trees in the surrounding areas. He asked the Township to provide \$500 for the materials.

- 8-1. Open Space Coordinator Lauren Wasilauski stated that the Recreation Department and the Shade Tree Committee have reviewed the proposal and will work with Matt on the location.
- 8-2. Administrator Nieman explained that the Township will need a list of the materials and the Township will provide the supplies for the Scout as the Township has tax exempt status.
- 8-3. **Motion #20-6-1** - Deputy Mayor Schuldiner moved the approval of the Eagle Scout project. The motion was seconded by Committeewoman Keenan and carried unanimously.

9. **PUBLIC COMMENT**

Township Clerk Donna Kukla read the following comments from the public:

- 9-1. Paul Blodgett, Berkley Avenue, asked if Montgomery Township has, in the past or at present, participated in any of the Federal government's Defense Logistics Agency's - Law Enforcement Support Office (LESO) programs, the so-called "1033 programs"?

Administrator Nieman replied that the Township does not and has never participated in this program. The Township does not believe that it is an appropriate program for any municipal Police Department. Police Director Gill concurred with Administrator Nieman.

- 9-2. Philip Millstein, Chicopee Drive, asked if the Township could do anything about the overgrown front lawn at the building across from Bank of America.

Township Administrator Nieman responded that the property is in foreclosure. Township Attorney Kevin Van Hise explained the property may be in some legal proceedings that may allow the Township an opportunity to move forward with some type of redevelopment of that site. The Township is in the research stage at this point.

- 9-3. Hossein Zolfaghari stated that over a month ago, a tree fell on the small wooden bridge on Princeton Avenue near the intersection of Mt. Lucas Road leaving the railings destroyed. The tree was removed but nothing further was done to repair the bridge.

Administrator Nieman responded that the Engineering Department and Public Works are working on this. He stated that there is an ownership issue that is being resolved.

- 9-4. Jack Garhart, Bayberry Lane, requested that a committee or community group be put together to recommend a name for the new municipal building.

Mayor Jaffer responded that, at present, there is no intention to name the new municipal building after a person. It will be called the Montgomery Municipal Center.

Mr. Garhart spoke about the Township's appropriations plan for the years 2019 to 2024 that he received from the Mayor on May 22nd 2020. Please confirm that based on these numbers that the total amount being raised per family will only be an average of \$30 a year and is the only increased planned for the next several years.

Chief Financial Officer Pitts responded that the \$30 per year total amount to be raised is the Township's goal. He also stated that the Township will be looking at appropriations also to ensure there won't be a large increase in the tax rate. Administrator Nieman stated that the 2020 municipal budget is \$1 million less than prior years.

Mr. Garhart asked if the Committee considered his suggestion for an independent review of Township expenses to help elevate any excess tax burden on the tax payers of Montgomery.

Mayor Jaffer responded that the Township did look into this. They weren't quite sure what the timing should be in terms of the emergence of COVID-19. The Township is planning to do this study.

10. **CLASSIFICATION OF PERMANENT POLICE OFFICERS - Salvatore Intili, Kendall Bohannon and Thomas Connell, Jr.**

BE IT RESOLVED That Salvatore Intili has completed his probationary period and is now classified as a permanent police officer effective June 7, 2020.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That Kendall Bohannon has completed her probationary period and is now classified as a permanent police officer effective June 7, 2020.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That Thomas Connell, Jr. has completed his probationary period and is now classified as a permanent police officer effective June 7, 2020.

10-1. Police Director Gill stated that the three officers were hired approximately 1½ years ago. He explained their academy training and their training within the department. He stated that he highly endorsed making these three officers permanent members of the Montgomery Township Police Department.

Mayor Jaffer inquired as to if there was a choice of academies that recruits are sent to. Director Gill explained that there a number of academies and which one the recruits are sent to depends on the dates that they would need to go.

10-2. Deputy Mayor Schuldiner moved the adoption of the foregoing resolution. The motion was seconded by Committeeman Huang and carried on the following:

11. **REQUEST FOR RELIEF FROM ROAD OPENING MORATORIUM ON WILLOW ROAD**

Administrator Nieman explained that the Habitat for Humanity project will need to connect to utilities that are in the street. Township Engineer Gail Smith supports this relief. He explained that the Township requires that once the connections are completed, the contractor must seal the trench in a very specific manner and the Engineering Department will inspect the work.

11-1. **Motion #20-6-2** - Deputy Mayor Schuldiner moved the approval of the relief from road opening moratorium on Willow Road. The motion was seconded by Committeewoman Keenan and carried unanimously.

C. **RESOLUTION #20-6-130 - AUTHORIZING THE TAX COLLECTOR TO PROCESS THIRD QUARTER "ESTIMATED" TAX BILLS, DUE AUGUST 1, 2020**

WHEREAS, In light of the disruption caused by the coronavirus outbreak, the State delayed the adoption of the State Fiscal Year 2021 Budget to September 30, 2020; and

WHEREAS, The Division of Local Government Services (DLGS) cannot certify State Aid allocations to municipal budgets until State Aid Appropriations are known; and

WHEREAS, The DLGS cannot approve municipal budgets and the County Board of Taxation cannot certify taxes until long after the June 30, 2020 deadline to process third quarter tax bills due August 1, 2020; and

WHEREAS, Without an adopted 2020 Municipal Budget and without a 2020 Certified Tax Rate, the Tax Collector cannot process the final 2020 Tax Levy; and

WHEREAS, The DLGS "strongly recommends" under Local Finance Notice 2020-07 "that municipalities prepare to issue estimated property tax bills for 2020;" and

WHEREAS, The Tax Collector/Chief Financial Officer, computed and certified an estimated Tax Levy necessary to bill third quarter taxes due August 1, 2020.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the Governing Body of the Montgomery Township, in the County of Somerset and State of New Jersey on this 18th day of June, 2020 that the Tax Collector is hereby authorized and directed to process estimated tax bills for the third quarterly installment of 2020 taxes; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, the third quarterly installment of 2020 taxes shall not be subject to interest until the later of August 10, 2020 or the twenty-fifth (25) calendar day after the date the estimated tax bills were mailed. The estimated tax bills shall contain a notice specifying the date on which interest may begin to accrue.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Montgomery Township Tax Collector is hereby authorized to prepare and issue estimated tax bills for the third installment of 2020 based upon an annualized levy analysis totaling \$124,436,351.55. The Tax Collector shall proceed and take such actions as are permitted and required by P.L. 1994, c.72 (N.J.S.A. 54:4-66.2 and 54:4-66.3).

D. **RESOLUTION #20-6-131 - RELEASE OF PERFORMANCE GUARANTEE - 71 Colfax Road**
(Block 31003, Lot 22)

WHEREAS, Alexander and Natasha Wolfson obtained Zoning Board of Adjustment approval with bulk variances and submission waivers for the above referenced project; and

WHEREAS, This project requires performance, safety and stabilization, and landscaping buffer guarantees, as well as inspection escrow; and

WHEREAS, To date, the applicant posted the performance guarantee (\$37,182.00), the safety and stabilization guarantee (\$5,000.00), and all required inspection escrow fees (\$2,763.25). The landscaping buffer guarantee (\$14,256.00) has not been posted; and

WHEREAS, The Wolfson's have requested release of the performance guarantee (\$37,182.00) due to project delays; and

WHEREAS, Gail Smith, Township Engineer has recommended that the Township Committee consider releasing the performance guarantee subject to the following conditions:

1. Alexander and Natasha Wolfson shall re-post the performance guarantee in the amount of \$37,182.00 prior to building permit and street excavation permit application; and
2. Alexander and Natasha Wolfson shall post the landscaping buffer guarantee in the amount of \$14,256.00 prior to building permit application.

2. The Township Committee has considered the application, and pursuant to the Order entered on June 16, 2020 by the Honorable Thomas C. Miller, A.J.S.C. in the matter of *Princeton Show Jumping, LLC vs. Township of Montgomery, et al.*, Docket No. SOM-L-674-20, the Township hereby grants the same.

WHEREAS, Pursuant to its duly approved Solid Waste Management Plan and amendments thereto, the County of Somerset has established a mandatory countywide recycling program; and

WHEREAS, The duly approved Solid Waste Management Plan and amendments thereto call for the execution of agreements by and between Somerset County and municipalities located within the County; and

WHEREAS, The Township of Montgomery desires to participate in the recycling program; and

WHEREAS, The award of this contract to the County pursuant to N.J.S.A. Section 13:1E-99.14 is an exception to the bidding requirements as set forth in the Local Public Contracts Law pursuant to N.J.S.A. Section 40A:11-5(2), and the Board of Public Utilities Somerset Waste Franchise for Somerset County; and

WHEREAS, The Chief Finance Officer has certified the extent to which funds for this contract are available pursuant to the temporary budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED By the Township Committee of the Township of Montgomery in Somerset County that the Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized to execute an agreement with Somerset County for the provision of recycling services for a one-year term beginning January 1, 2020 through and including December 31, 2020.

13. **RESOLUTION 20-6-136 - A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING BID IN CONNECTION WITH THE PRIVATE SALE OF LAND OWNED BY THE TOWNSHIP OF MONTGOMERY AND NO LONGER NEEDED FOR PUBLIC USE**

WHEREAS, The Township of Montgomery is the record owner of a +.66 acre parcel of vacant land located along Route 206 and designated on the Montgomery Township Tax Assessment Maps (rev.ed. 2017) as Block 28005, Lot 60.02, formerly a portion of Lot 60, (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, The Local Lands and Buildings Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:12-13(b)(5), authorizes municipalities to convey property not needed for a public use to the highest responsible bidder from among adjacent property owners at a private sale if the parcel is without any capital improvements and is less than the minimum size required for development under the Township's Land Development Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, The Township of Montgomery authorized the sale of said Property pursuant to Ordinance 20-1636; and

WHEREAS, In accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A: 12-13(b)(5), the Township of Montgomery advertised this property for private sale to the highest bidder on May 26, 2020 in the Courier News, and received bids on June 15, 2020; and

WHEREAS, Village Shoppes at Montgomery, LLC was the highest bidder at a private sale held on June 15, 2020, with a bid in the amount of Three Hundred Five Thousand (\$305,000.00) Dollars; and

WHEREAS, Village Shoppes at Montgomery, LLC presented a check in the amount of Thirty Thousand Five Hundred (\$30,500) Dollars after the bidding period was concluded as the deposit required by the conditions of sale; and

WHEREAS, The Local Lands and Buildings Law requires the governing body to accept the highest or reject all bids; and

WHEREAS, The Township Committee desires to accept the highest responsible bid for the Property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Montgomery, County of Somerset, State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. The preamble to this resolution is hereby incorporated as if fully restated herein.

14. **RESOLUTION #20-6-137 - DESIGNATING SPECIFIC TRACTS OF MUNICIPALLY-OWNED PARKS AND OPEN SPACES TO BE INCLUDED IN MONTGOMERY TOWNSHIP'S DEER MANAGEMENT PROGRAM PURSUANT TO CHAPTER IX, SECTION 9 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MONTGOMERY (1984) FOR THE HUNTING SEASON BEGINNING IN SEPTEMBER 2020 AND ENDING IN FEBRUARY 2021**

WHEREAS, As part of a comprehensive deer management plan and for the purpose of reducing the Township's white-tailed deer population, the Township Committee of the Township of Montgomery amended Chapter IX, "Parks and Recreation" of the Code of the Township of Montgomery (1984) ("Code") to allow limited hunting on the Township's parks and open spaces for the purpose of culling white-tailed deer; and

WHEREAS, Section 9-9 of the Code authorizes the Township Committee to designate annually by resolution which parks and open spaces will be made available for hunting through the Township's municipal deer management program and during which dates;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MONTGOMERY As follows:

1. Pursuant to Section 9-9 of the Code of the Township of Montgomery (1984), the hunting of white-tailed deer will be allowed on the properties listed below within the timeframes established by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, Division of Fish and Wildlife ("State"). AA. Mill Pond

Location: 7.7± acres on Mill Pond Road

Seasons/dates: This property shall be open only to bow hunters during the dates established for bow hunting by the State of New Jersey for deer management zones 12 and 14 for 2020-2021, including fall bow, permit bow, and winter bow. The specific dates on which hunting will be permitted are as follows, except that in the event any of the dates set forth below are inconsistent with any dates established by the State for the appropriate season, the State's dates shall apply, unless limited in specific instances by the Township of Montgomery in accordance with paragraph 2 of this Resolution:

Permits: No more than one (1) municipal deer management permits, and no more than two (2) Youth Hunting permits, shall be issued for this property. Permit eligibility for this property is restricted to 2019-2020 permittees who (i) harvested at least two (2) antlerless deer during the 2019-2020 season in accordance with the terms of their permit and (ii) pay the full permit price for this property to be their primary hunting assignment (i.e., \$100.00). Each permittee shall meet on site with a representative of the Wildlife Committee prior to commencement of the season.

Other restrictions: Properly licensed persons hunting deer are authorized to take coyotes or foxes during the fall bow, permit bow, and winter bow seasons if the coyote or fox is encountered before said person has taken the season bag limit of deer. However, after the person has taken a daily bag limit of deer he or she must cease hunting immediately.

Properly licensed persons hunting deer who have a valid turkey season permit from the New Jersey Division of Fish and Wildlife are authorized to take turkeys of either sex during the one week of the permit bow season that coincides with the fall turkey season if the turkey is encountered before said permittee has taken the season bag limit of deer. However, after the person has taken a daily bag limit of deer he or she must cease hunting immediately.

Hunting on Sundays shall be strictly prohibited.

Permittees must hunt from an elevated tree stand, and shall use a full-body safety harness.

2. Except as otherwise set forth, hunting shall be allowed only during the dates designated by the State of New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, Division of Fish and Wildlife for the applicable seasons listed above. The specific dates shall be set forth on each permit. Any dates set forth on the permits notwithstanding, the Township may make it a condition of any permit that hunting not take place on certain days as may be necessary to protect the health and safety of the public.

3. The incidental taking of a coyote or fox while engaging in deer hunting on properties enumerated in the Resolution is permissible, provided that hunters abide by all State regulations on coyote or fox hunting. Permittees are authorized to take coyotes or foxes while hunting white-tailed deer on such property, provided that the taking of coyotes or foxes is incidental to, and not separate from, their deer hunting activities during the six-day firearm, muzzleloader rifle permit, shotgun permit, fall bow, permit bow, or winter bow deer seasons if the coyote or fox is encountered before said permittee has taken the season bag limit of deer. However, after the permittee has taken a daily bag limit of deer he or she must cease hunting immediately. Incidental hunting of coyote or fox while deer hunting may resume the following day (provided the season remains open and the season bag limit of deer has not been reached). The hunting of coyote or fox at night is strictly prohibited.

(Item #14 Cont.)

4. The incidental taking of turkey while engaging in deer hunting on properties enumerated in the Resolution is permissible, provided that hunters abide by all State regulations on turkey hunting. Permittees with a valid turkey season permit from the New Jersey Division of Fish and Wildlife are authorized to take turkeys of either sex during the fall turkey season, provided that the taking of turkeys is incidental to, and not separate from, their deer hunting activities during the one week of the permit bow season that coincides with the fall turkey season if the turkey is encountered before said permittee has taken the season bag limit of deer. The bag limit is one turkey per permit, but only one bird may be taken in a given day, regardless of the number of permits a hunter holds. However, after the permittee has taken a daily bag limit of deer he or she must cease hunting immediately. Incidental hunting of turkey while deer hunting may resume the following day (provided the season remains open and the season bag limit of deer has not been reached). *The hunting, shooting or killing any other game is strictly prohibited.*
 5. Hunting may take place only pursuant to the requirements set forth in Section 9-9 of the Code of the Township of Montgomery (1984) ("Code") and all applicable State and local regulations. In the event of any inconsistency, the more restrictive standard shall govern.
 6. Pursuant to Section 9-9 of the Code, every permittee shall be required to participate in a hunter orientation and safety course to be conducted by an agent of the New Jersey Division of Fish and Wildlife, as well as in a property-specific hunter orientation and safety course to be conducted by a member of the Montgomery Township Wildlife Committee.
 7. Warning signs shall be posted at the entrances to the properties designated above and in the vicinity of tree stands; in addition, the properties shall be posted in accordance with any specific terms and conditions of the individual permits.
 8. All permittees shall be required to check in with the Police Department prior to hunting any property. This procedure shall be required each time the permittee intends to hunt.
 9. A press release and a legal notice in a form approved by the Township Attorney notifying the public of the above designated dates and locations shall be published on the Township's website and in the Township's newsletter and shall be submitted to the Township's officially-designated newspapers as well as such others newspaper or newspapers as may be deemed advisable to publicize the above-referenced dates and locations as widely as possible. In addition, individual notices shall be sent to all property owners situated within two hundred feet of the properties set forth above.
 10. The Township reserves the right to modify the conditions and restrictions set forth above at any time, including after issuance of 2020-2021 permits, in the interests of the public health, safety and welfare of Township residents.
 11. Permittees are limited to use of one portable tree stand per permittee.
- 14-1. Open Space Coordinator Lauren Wasilauski explained that there were properties added for the 2020-2021 hunting season. She explained that they were looking at a pilot program to use ground blinds on a couple of the bow only properties without pathways. She stated that the New Jersey Department of Fish and Wildlife is recommending other municipalities who are considering such a program to look at Montgomery's as a model. Wildlife Management Committee Chair Jamie McQuaid reiterated Ms. Wasilauski's comments.
- 14-2. Deputy Mayor Schuldiner asked if the goal of adding more space is to allow for greater culling of the herd in town. Ms. Wasilauski and Mr. McQuaid confirmed that this was the reason.
- 14-3. Committeeman Huang asked about the process of the program. Ms. Wasilauski stated that the resolution was on the agenda to specify the tracts, the hunting dates and some clarification of existing rules. At an upcoming Township Committee meeting there will be an ordinance introduction to address the New Jersey Division of Fish and Wildlife recommendations. The public hearing and adoption of the ordinance would happen at a following meeting.
- 14-4. Township Clerk Donna Kukla stated that Richard Ober, Stonebridge resident, called and asked if the Township was taking into consideration his suggestions from the last meeting regarding the Ingersoll-Rand property (Stonebridge). Ms. Wasilauski explained that this property was one of the original hunting properties dating back to approximately 2001. She stated that hunters traditionally don't want to put their tree stands near a pathway because the scent of people will put off the deer. She stated that there have been no safety issues on any of the hunting properties since the inception of the program. Deputy Mayor Schuldiner asked if any notification is given to Stonebridge about when the hunters are on the property. Ms. Wasilauski stated that this has not been done in the past. Administrator Nieman suggested notifying Stonebridge of the hunting dates. Mr. McQuaid stated that there are signs posted at every property with the hunting dates, the rules and safety suggestions, plus the hunters post the property with "Hunting in Progress" signs. He expressed the concern that if the Township limits the pathway access, as most of the properties do have pathways, this will limit the amount of space for hunting therefore limiting the culling of the deer. Ms. Wasilauski stated that one of the compromises that was discussed was the possibly of putting in a buffer from the paved pathways at Stonebridge. Committeewoman Keenan suggested having a meeting with Stonebridge and its residents.

14-5. Committeewoman Keenan asked if there was a total number of deer that were donated to "Hunters for the Hungry". Mr. McQuaid stated that in the 2019-2020 hunting season there were approximately 44 deer donated.

21. **CONDEMNING RACISM, RACIALLY BASED VIOLENCE AND PREJUDICE**

21-1. Administrator Nieman read the following statement he sent to all employees of the Township:

"I am sending this memo to you as your Township Administrator and a career public servant who has dedicated himself to treating every citizen I serve as I wish to be treated regardless of race, ethnicity, gender, or religion. I am repulsed by the deaths of George Floyd, Rashard Brooks, Breonna Taylor, Ahmaud Arbery, and all persons whose lives were taken from them through senseless racist or biased violence.

We are all public servants whose salaries and benefits are funded by all the taxpayers and we have an obligation to serve each and every member of the public with the same respect that we would wish to be treated. We also have an obligation to treat each of our co-workers with that same level of respect.

I am very proud of the people who work for Montgomery Township and I believe and have repeated many times in public that Montgomery has one of the best municipal staffs in the state. Reinforce my belief in all of you by treating everyone you serve or work with the respect they deserve. If you see or hear any demonstration of inappropriate behavior or physical force used against any member of the public or staff or demonstrated by the public or staff you have a duty to report it.

I will continue to dedicate myself to condemn all types of racism, violence, bias, and excessive force. Furthermore, I will continue to support equality for all and an end to systemic racism and bias crimes. We are all in this effort together and I believe that all of us will work towards these common goals. Join with me to make sure this happens not just for all of us but for our children and their children. This is long overdue."

21-2. Committeewoman Keenan read the following statement:

"Will the outrage sparked by the video of a white policeman suffocating a black man for 8 minutes and 46 seconds while three other police officers either participated or did nothing to stop him continue to motivate us or will we turn our attention elsewhere? Is this a turning point for the United States? Will something really change?

Black people have suffered from centuries of inequality and racism, the burden of dismantling racism cannot continue to fall on the shoulders of those it continues to oppress. The institutions (governments, schools, businesses) and the people with power - those who benefit from systemic racism and bias must step up. White people like me. The dominant culture, the laws, the policies, the financial practices, the criminal justice system (the list goes on and on) support, protect and advance people like me. White people, we must face some hard truths.

Our country was founded on systemic racism. We have been taught history through white tinted lenses. Our history starts when a white man "discovered" North America - even though it was inhabited for thousands of years by indigenous people. We are taught to revere the founding fathers, all white men, and many slaveholders, as well as white cowboys and white pioneers who tamed the Wild West. The list goes on and on.

We start our own history here in Montgomery with stories of Dutch colonists and not the Lenape people. The history of slavery in New Jersey is ignored. New Jersey was the last Northern state to finally abolish slavery in 1846. In 1923, the first Ku Klux Klan funeral held in New Jersey was right here in Blawenburg. This is our truth.

As a white person, I have a built-in advantage throughout my life because I am white. White privilege exists and persists because of enduring racism and biases. *"White privilege is not just the power to find what you need in a convenience store or to move through the world without your race defining your interactions. It's not just the subconscious comfort of seeing a world that serves you as normal. It's also the power to remain silent in the face of racial inequity. It's the power to weigh the need for protest or confrontation against the discomfort or inconvenience of speaking up. It's getting to choose when and where you want to take a stand. It's knowing that you and your humanity are safe."*¹

White people in America need to do three things: 1: Educate ourselves about what inequality and racism mean in the United States and how our privilege as white people is a huge part of that story. 2: Listen and self-reflect 3: Use our privilege and power to help make the change.

22. **LIBRARY**

Committeewoman Keenan reported that there has been some progress on the library. She stated that a five-party library agreement is currently under Attorney review. The five parties are: Somerset County, Somerset County Library Commission, Mary Jacobs Library Foundation, Rocky Hill Borough and Montgomery Township. It is hoped that this will move forward shortly.

23. **COMCAST**

Committeewoman Gural spoke about the conversation from the June 4 Township Committee meeting regarding the difficulty some of the residents in the area of Route 601 are having with connectivity and signal strength with Comcast. She read the following comment from Skip Carter, one of the residents of this area, into the record:

"I reviewed the Comcast franchise application and large map, and unfortunately struck out. It shows a hole of service on Route 601 between Broadway and Dutchtown-Harlingen Road. Still worth a try. Nonetheless, thank you all for your help. Other than an email campaign to Comcast's headquarters in Philadelphia, I'm out of options. Hopefully, school will be in-person in the fall, but I doubt it. One suggestion I have for the Township Committee is: Montgomery receives 2% revenue share of all residents' recurring monthly bills, it would be appropriate for this revenue to be dedicated to a fund to build out the very few remaining neighborhoods currently without service. At least on the CenturyLink side of town where the only other communication option is turtle slow, antiquated and unusable DSL. The Verizon side of town likely has modern alternatives. In these times, communications are as critical as paved roads."

Administrator Nieman stated that the Township could look at what it would cost to build it out. He explained that the money the Township gets is actually put into surplus and a percentage of it, he believes, goes to the schools. He stated that the "hole", which the Board of Public Utilities approved, was due to the lack of density.

24. **2020 CENSUS**

Deputy Mayor Schuldiner reported that Montgomery is at 75.5% returns of the 2020 census. He urged the remaining 24.5% of the households to fill out and return their census form.

25. **ROUTE 601 BRIDGE OVER BACK BROOK**

Administrator Nieman stated that he had received confirmation that the Route 601 Bridge over Back Brook will be opening on June 19.

26. **NEW MUNICIPAL COMPLEX**

Administrator Nieman stated that he had an email from the Somerset County Engineering Department that, because of the number of questions from contractors who are bidding on the new Municipal Complex project, they have extended the bidding deadline to July 14.

27. **TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE UPDATES**

27-1. **MONTGOMERY SPEAKS OUT AGAINST RACISM AND MONTGOMERY FOR JUSTICE**

Deputy Mayor Schuldiner and Committeeman Huang attended the Montgomery Speaks Out Against Racism Zoom meeting through One Montgomery and Montgomery Mosaic. They also attended the Montgomery for Justice event hosted by Monty for Justice. They found these events very powerful and the speakers very brave. They thanked the organizers.

27-2. **OPEN SPACE COMMITTEE**

Committeeman Huang reported that Open Space Coordinator Lauren Wasilauski met with the County Open Space Committee to present the Township's recent purchase of the property on Route 518 for a possible cost sharing. The Open Space Committee continued the conversation with the Planning Board on updating the Master Plan and formalizing some of the rural corridors.

27-3. **ZONING BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT**

Committeeman Huang reported that the Zoning Board of Adjustment reviewed the submission waivers on the application for the Dead Tree Run Road cell tower. There will be follow up meetings on this subject.

27-4. **BUSINESS TASK FORCE**

Committeewoman Keenan reported that the Business Task Force held a Montgomery Business Forum. She stated that a lot of good questions were asked of the Health Officer and the Board of Health.

27-5. BOARD OF HEALTH

Committeewoman Gural reported that the Board of Health discussed COVID-19 and the upcoming re-opening of some businesses in the Township.

27-6. SOMERSET COUNTY PLANNING PARTNERS FORUM

Deputy Mayor Schuldiner reported that he attended the Somerset County Planning Partners Forum. They covered a number of different topics including advancing the Walk/Bike/Hike Somerset County study, and the Park RX initiative.

27-7. TRANSPORTATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Deputy Mayor Schuldiner reported that the Transportation Advisory Committee discussed the 2020 Local Aid project, the 2020 Roads program, the Blue Spring Road Improvement project, the Crusier Brook Bridge project, and the Route 601 Bridge replacement over Back Brook. There was also an update on the Railroad Quiet Zones.

27-8. MONTY CARES INITIATIVE

Deputy Mayor Schuldiner reported that the Monty Cares Initiative has launched. He stated people can go to MontyCares.org if they are in need of some service, such as not being able to leave their home, not having enough food, etc.

27-9. TOWNSHIP FOOD PANTRY

Deputy Mayor Schuldiner reported that the Montgomery Food Pantry will start collecting food in early July. He stated that right now all that is being collected is money to give Shop Rite gift cards to people who need them.

27-10. MONTGOMERY SPEAKS OUT AGAINST RACISM

Mayor Jaffer stated she attended the Montgomery Speaks Out Against Racism virtual event which was very well attended by 188 participants.

27-11. BLACK PARENTS' GROUP

Mayor Jaffer reported on a meeting that the Black Parents Group had with the Montgomery Police Department.

27-12. MONTY FOR JUSTICE

Mayor Jaffer stated that she has been meeting with the organizer for Monty for Justice event. She spoke about some of the comments which were made at the recent Board of Education which were heart wrenching. She stated that she spoke with the Board of Education President and the Monty for Justice organizer about doing a collaborative forum for the School Board, School Administration, Township Administration, Montgomery elected officials, Rocky Hill elected officials, and some of the community groups.

27-13. RALLY FOR JUSTICE

Mayor Jaffer reported on a Rally for Justice which she attended in Newark. She stated she felt it was really meaningful to see how other communities in New Jersey are dealing with this issue.

27-14. JUNETEENTH

Mayor Jaffer stated that at 5:00 p.m. on June 19 One Montgomery is organizing a discussion with Assemblyman Craig Stanley in celebration of and in commemoration of Juneteenth.

28. Committeewoman Gural and Committeeman Huang left the meeting.

29. RESOLUTION TO CLOSE MEETING TO THE PUBLIC

BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Montgomery in Somerset County, New Jersey as follows:
